

Bunny's Egg Basket

When spring is here, can Easter be far behind? And with it, thoughts of bunnies, chicks, ducks, and plenty of eggs. The image of a rabbit bearing eggs and other assorted goodies to children on the night before Easter was first mentioned in Georg Frank von Frankenu's *De ovis paschalibus* (*About Easter Eggs*) in 1682. Here is a free-form panel that will be the perfect reminder of this age-old tradition.

The pattern comes to us from the pattern book, *Easter Parade*, by Marianne Crivellaro, which is part of *The Ultimate Pattern Book, Volume 2*. With twelve complete pattern books included, the volume contains over 300 full-size patterns that are designed for beginners and intermediate artists and hobbyists. In addition to stained glass projects, the designs could also be appropriate for working in mosaics or fused glass. Besides *Easter Parade*, the collection also includes *Fabulous Florals*, *Deck the Halls*, *Luck of the Irish*, *Paws*, and *More Little Women*, plus six other complete pattern books.


